Lego Therapy is a group intervention ran by our in-school ELSAs, Miss Hunt and Mrs Dawson. The intervention runs during school time for 6 weeks. The intervention is specific, structured, and targeted at building teamwork, social skills, communication, taking turns, and eye contact. It is not just playing with Lego! Upon completion of the intervention, students are entered for an AQA Unit Award to recognise their hard work and achievement.
