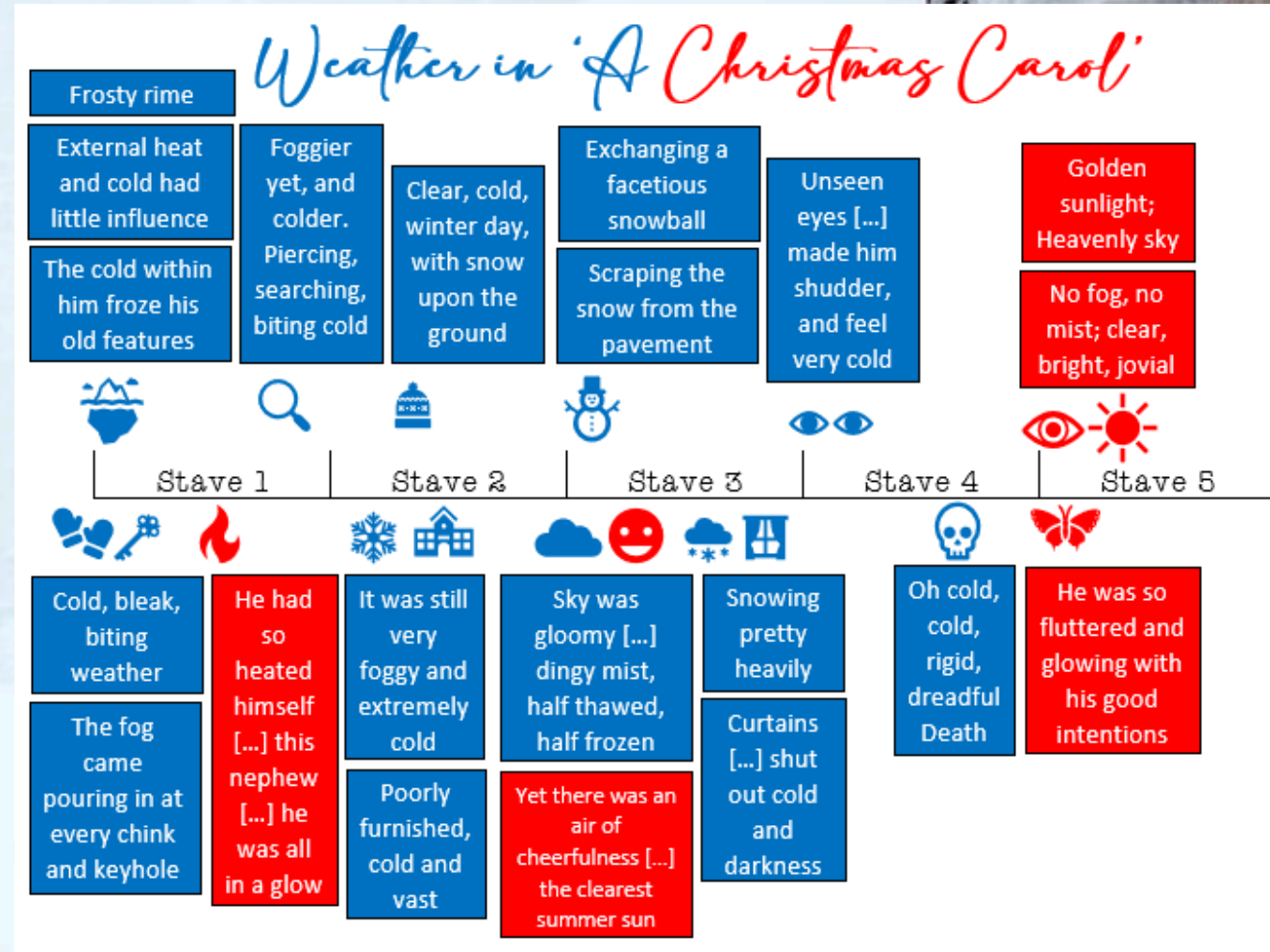


ANALYSIS Motif: Weather

If the weather is representative of mindset, consider:

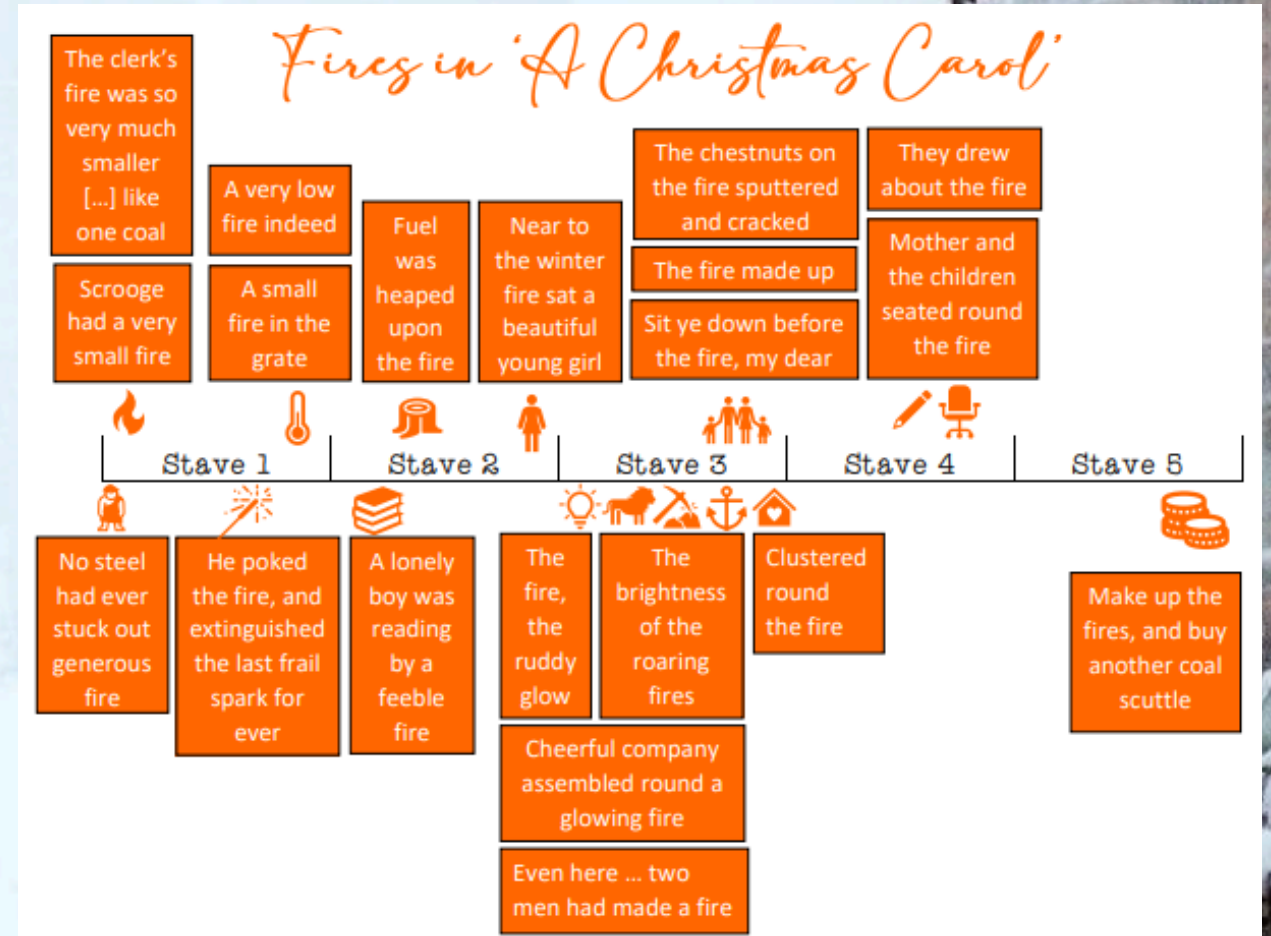
- Look in detail at the fog and what this suggests about Scrooge
- Look at how the temperature changes throughout
- Consider how people protect themselves from the snow
- Why might Fred be described as heated?
- Look at glow in stave 1 and stave 5, and what this indicates
- Consider the change from fog to clear sky and how this links to Scrooge's transformation



ANALYSIS Motif: Fire

If fire represents the warmth of family, consider:

- How Scrooge's fire is represented in stave one and two, and why
- How the Cratchits are linked to fires throughout
- How when walking through London at Christmas, Scrooge sees the fires
- How fire is used in lonely Christmases of stave 3
- The fire at Fred's house and what this symbolises
- How Scrooge's attitudes towards fire changes in stave 5 from stave 1, and what this represents



ANALYSIS Notif: Children

If children represents the innocence, consider:

- How Scrooge's actions towards children at the start show his true nature
- How the various references to Tiny Tim make us consider Scrooge's impact on wider society
- How Scrooge's childhood impacts him as an adult
- Where Scrooge becomes childlike, almost reborn again
- How Ignorance and Want represent humanity's ills
